What does the Little Prince mean when he says, “a flower of no consequence” (p.51)? 2. What is the deeper meaning of the “echo” (pgs. 53-54)? 3. “And he felt very unhappy. His flower had told him she was the only one of her kind in the whole universe. And here were five thousand of them, just alike, in just one garden! All I own is just an ordinary rose” (pgs. 55-56). How does this quote illustrate the Little Prince’s misunderstanding of what his own flower said to him? 4. What does the fox mean by “tamed,” and what is its deeper meaning? 5. Why would the fox’s life go from monotonous to being “filled with sunshine” if he were to be tamed (p.59-60)? 6. How does the concept of a “rite” fit into what the Fox is saying about being “tamed”? 7. What does “One sees clearly only with the heart. Anything essential is invisible to the eyes” (pg. 63).
