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Wednesday	Notes:	<p>Objective: Utilize the Crop tool by understanding the Rule of Thirds</p> <p>Lesson Overview: Break up the categories into the selection area, touch up area, and other tools (text etc.) Remind them to make these portrait style, they are to place the text themselves, make it look real, and try to find the best images possible for a match with their pictures so it looks good.</p> <p>Toolbar Basics Part 1 Pull up the picture of the car or the house with the ocean behind it and go over the different tools (make sure they are in the normal mode in the control panel and also have them look at the different options in the control panel as they go along)</p> <p>Crop Tool -Crops picture to a smaller area (click and drag to crop and hit enter)</p> <p>Eyedropper Tool- used to select certain colors in an image to make it your active color (click on area to pick up color)</p> <p>Spot Healing Brush- used to take out unwanted areas and combine it with its surrounding (click and paint over area then let go)</p> <p>Brush tool- Much like in AI, used to make strokes and placing symbols etc. (select size and type of brush from brush menu- ALT with pick up a selected color)</p> <p>Clone Stamp Tool- Used to pick up an image to copy it somewhere else (find image and use your ALT key to target the area to copy)</p> <p>Eraser- Erases completely (you can change the size in the control panel)</p> <p>Background Eraser Tool- Picks up the center and erases that color range (Adjust the target using the control panel to target what you want erased)</p> <p>Magic Eraser- Works the same as the magic wand and erases the color selection that is selected</p>	Academic Standards:
